# YAGR'S Reunion

YAGR'S will be holding its 6th reunion in San Diego, CA on June 14, 15, 16, 2001.

Our host hotel will be the Town & Country Resort and Convention Center, 500 Hotel Circle North, San Diego, CA 92108. To make your reservations phone 1-800-772-8527. Our room rate will be \$90.00 per night. When you call the hotel to make your room reservations, let them know that you are with the YAGR'S group. You must make your room rations by May 25, 2001 to guarantee that you

a room will be available for you. The Town & Country will extend the \$90.00 rate for 3 days before and 3 days after the reunion dates. If you have any problems making your reservations, get in touch with

me. A note to smokers: Make sure you inform the hotel that you want a smoking room.

The Town and Country is the largest hotel by far that we have held our reunion in. It covers an area of over 40 acres of gardens and grounds. It also offers 5 restaurants - everything from a deli and food court to fine dining. While this is a large complex, all of our function rooms will be close to one another.


For those of you who will not have a car, the San Diego trolley stops adjacent to the hotel (a 2 minute walk). This will get you to most of the area attractions and downtown San Diego; and if you walk for another minute, you will be at the Fashion Valley Mall.

If you are arriving by car, parking will cost \$6.00 per night (all of the local hotels charge for parking). You will be within a 10 or 15 minute drive of the area's attractions. RV's are able to park on site, parking only.

#### Reservations and Hotel rooms

It is strongly recommended that you make your hotel reservations as early as possible. YAGR'S has set aside 100 rooms



at the Town and Country. As I talk to people, I am getting the feeling that we will need to arrange for more rooms. But until I start to see how many reservations are made, I will have no idea of how many more rooms we might need. We do not want the same problem we had in Minneapolis when some people waited too long to make their reservations and were not able to get a room at the hotel.

#### **Reunion Registration**

You will notice that we have changed the registration fee format this year. The new format is as follows:

**Dues paying members** and their spouses/guests - the cost will be \$75.00 per person

Non dues paying members and their spouses guests - the cost will be \$85.00 per person

A dues paying member is anyone who has paid his dues for the YAGR'S year of June 1, 2000 to May 31, 2001. To determine whether you have paid your dues, look on the mailing label on the envelope that this YAGRGRAM came in. If there is a date above your name, you have paid your dues. If there is no date above your name, your dues are now due.

#### **Reunion Schedule**

The reunion format will be the same as the past 5 reunions. The hospitality room will be kept open as much as possible.

Friday the 15th of June we will go on our group tour. At this time the tour has not been finalized due to a couple of possibilities we are looking at.

Saturday the 16th of June in the morning the men will hold their meeting. At the same time the spouses/guests will be holding their penny social/breakfast. Saturday evening will be the banquet for all.


Sunday the 17th of June check out of hotel. Reunion comes to a close.

PENNY SOCIAL



# Radar Picket Ship Exhibit

USS Massachusetts Work onboard

Roland Cote, AGR-10, 1960-62) and Harry Miller, (AGR-11, 1962-64, YR-65 1964-65) have been working onboard the Massachusetts to build and erect the wooden bulkheads that will be used to display the signs for the 16 ships and that will house a model of a ship that was built for our exhibit.

They were joined by a group of former crewmen on board the ship on the 21st and 22nd of October. This group included John Hemminger (AGR-2, 1960-61), Tom Giardina (AGR-3, 1961-63), Bill Hinman (AGR-4, 1955-57), Tom Manning (AGR-4, 1955-57), and Al Nannini (AGR-15, 1960-62).

When they departed the ship on Sunday the wooden bulkheads were just about completed and a platform that is over 21 feet had been built. The platform will be used for a large display depicting

history of radar that the Battleship Massachusetts has onboard and in storage because it did not fit in with any of their existing exhibits.

Roland and Harry have since gone aboard to finish up the bulkheads and to make and install brackets for the lighting, model, and ships wheel (helm).

The cleaning and preparation of the compartment has also started. Once this is done the painting of the compartment will get started. This work is being done by others as per the vote taken at the Minneapolis reunion.


#### The Exhibit





Bill Hinman (on the left) Tom Manning and Tom Giardina (in background) test fitting radar display on platform base



Al Nannini working on platform






Wooden bulkheads shown before completion.





Tracer being readied for tow to China




Tracer being turned into channel

#### The Ships Carried

Fuel Oil:

443,646 gallons

Fresh Water:

15,083 gallons

Feed Water:

35,710 gallons

Diesel Oil:

68,267 gallons

Received from Charles Brewster (AGR-12, 1960-63)

The steaming radius at 7.3 knots was 16,800 miles (7.3 knots was the most economical speed).

The appoximate diameter turning circle at 10 knots was 1,200 yards.

It took 15 - 30 seconds for the rudder to move from full left to full right at 10 knots.

The maximum speed on one boiler, 7.7 knots (47 rpm) Received from Don Baldwin (AGR-4, 1961-63)
